





# Report 2020-2021

# The Webinar was conducted by Ministry of India, New Delhi.

On the occasion of completion of 1<sup>st</sup> anniversary of NEP-2020, an initiative made by Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi this national webinar has been organized collaboratively by *Minister of State for Education, Minister of School Education and Minister of Higher Education, UGC and AICTE.* 

Mr. Rajeneesh Jain, Secretary of UGC hosted the inaugural functional where Mr. D. K. Singh, Chairman of UGC welcomed all the distinguished speakers and delegates.

Mr. Anil Kare, Secretary of Higher Education, under his opening remarks beautifully explained how best Indian values must be a part of Indian education. He strongly mentioned that the changing global era is emphasing the students to move from traditional/historical learning to global competency. Students from different streams should have a global outlook but roots must lay in India. He also mentioned that this webinar aims in bringing out Indian values inculcating in Indian Education System through multidisciplinary and Holistic Education.

The chief Guest, *Mr. Subhas Sarakar Hon'ble Minister of State for Education*, addressing the gathering mentioned that the NEP is guided by the reach heritage of Ancient and Eternal Indian knowledge and balances between the fundamentals of bharatiya ethos and global trains, by adopting technological themes in education. Remembering the greatest development made in education by ancient great king *Shri Krishnadevaraya*, sir narrated that ancient education has always been a back bone for the enrichment of holistic education. He also mentioned that teachers are the primary source of imparting skills in students through innovative and creating teaching methods. He told that teachers must study the attitudes, skills behaviors of students and develop them based on holistic models such as ethical, moral, social, global knowledge and life skills etc., which are very essential skills in this global era. Reminding the Sustainant Development Goals given by United Nations, SDG – 4 which speaks about free, equitable and primary

to all boys and girls, "Make in India" and "Athmanirbhara" has been initiated to encount keep the lead in the development of our country, which is possible by skill based learning minds.

#### First Technical Session: "Holistic Education & NEP-2020"

First technical session was chaired by *Prof. Rama Shankar Dube, Vice-Chancellor of Cembersity of Gujarat*, in his address towards the webinar he propounded that how best the NEP-202 braced holistic education in India. He prominently mentioned that how the ancient educational institutions such has Takshashila, Nalanda, Vallabhi etc., focused on holistic education which has a blend of materialism with spirituality. He also elaborated the significance of NEP-2020 which included environmental education, life skills, value based education, holistic education etc., which impart physical social, emotional, intellectual, moral, professional, technical disciplines. He summarized the words by mentioning that highly capable, socially acceptable, skilled and enterprising youth will be produced to provide leadership in various spheres to face national and global changes with dedication towards the human values and which are rooted in glorious Indian culture and traditions.

Prof. Sunena Singh, Vice Chancellor of Nalanda University, addressing the webinar mentioned that NEP-2020 gives us huge flip and freedom to look at different disciplines. She also told that the dynamic education system can be fostered by not only the rules and policies given by the Ministry of Education but also by the educational institutions. She told to synergize the creative, reflective or creative thinking, entrepreneurship, scientific, compassion, community services etc., must be explored along with cognitive, intellectual and knowledge based education. She also emphased on six core concepts to be adopted in holistic education by modifying the curriculum such as critical thinking or analytical thinking, good judgment or ability of self govern or problems solving skills, meta learning – learning in one zone of freedom of learning or experiential learning, social ability, refining values and self knowledge or emotional development.

Prof. Bhadri Narayan Vilas, Director and Professor at GB Pant Social Institute, Allahabad, told in his speech that holistic education creates cultural values and human values to build a new nation. The knowledge produced through the introduction of NEP-2020, is the knowledge developed through experience which help the nation to build through holistic education.

# Second Technical Session - "Multidisciplinary Education and NEP-2020"

Second technical session was chaired by *Prof. M. K. Shridhar Makam, Member of UGC, former Member Secretary of Karnataka Knowledge Commission and Karnataka State Innovation Council*, in his address towards the webinar he told that multidisciplinary education is very essential to make the holistic education get to be used to its maximum way. He emphased that the curricular activities and syllabus must be included with multidiscipline subjects and multiple programs which can support students to face global competency. He explained that how the World Economic Forum released the new 21<sup>st</sup> century skills which are related to ways of thinking, ways of working, tools for working and skills for living in the world and how 21<sup>st</sup> century education must be shaped on different skills and such skills like active learning, innovative learning, meta learning etc., can be developed by multidisciplinary programs.

**Prof. Anant Kumar Singh, Director General of Nirma University**, in his speech propounded that integration of different subjects in one form can develop holistic education. He also told that students much understand how the different subjects can help them to develop globally by inculcating various skills. He also told that colleges and institutions should implement integrated subjects and proper infrastructure to move fast for expedite learning to achieve the objective of multidisciplinary education.

Prof. Blim Rao Maitri, Director of IIM Nagapur, in his speech told that multidisciplinary education provides three major perspectives for students such as, develop the rich view of the world, get

de range of perspective to the students encounter during their studies and combination of subjects will ffer students more flexible employment opportunities. He also told about important outcomes of multidisciplinary education in teaching for universities such as flexible curriculum, new pedagogy to encourage multidisciplinary thinking and the capability related disciplines to be developed which support the student to increase their thinking power. He also told that students much be helped to their mindset which can empower them in their feature through multidisciplinary education.

Third Technical Session - "Multiple Entry and Exit through Academic Bank of Credit"

Prof. V. K. Jain, Vice Chancellor of Tejapur University, spoke during the session that objectives of the multiple entry and exit option support to remove the rigid boundaries and facilitate new possibilities for learners and offer flexibility in curriculum and discipline specific offers, offer different designs of masters program, to enable credit accommodation and transfer along with provision of evaluation and validation and encasing the credit to students. He also elaborated in detail the guidelines on multiple entry and exit through academic credit launched by Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, on 29th July 2021.

Prof. Nageshwar Rao, Vice Chancellor of IGNOU, during the session he told that the Universities and Institutions should move from program based education to course based education. The ABC method will help the students to bring out their individual capabilities. He also told that the MOE has given all the facilities to bring out holistic learning or course based programs which can reach the remote areas and help the students to face global competition and develop their entrepreneurial skills.

Prof. Avinash Chandra Pande, Directro of Inter University Accelerator Centre, New Delhi, during his speech he told that students get their own basket to pick up any subjects for their studies. It is the student centric and learning based education system which pay the way for holistic and multidisciplinary system in higher education. This helps the students to roboost their knowledge and suie their aptitude. It also helps to enable the students for lifelong learning capability. Multiple entry and exit help the students to connect different domains of knowledge and to acquire the right foundations and building blocks to pursue their life goals.

#### Conclusion:

Under the conclusion of this webinar on "Multidisciplinary Education and Holistic Education" which was a part of the completion of one year of transformative reforms under the NEP-2020, Dr. D. K. Singh concluded the speech by remarking that the multidisciplinary and holistic education will make India self reliant and globally competent. Integration of social, ethical, moral, professional, human skills, scientific, intellectual, life skills etc., will bring out dynamic, innovative and creative learning. With flexible multiple entry and exit will provide students to gain the knowledge of various courses and subjects and enhance their capabilities which help to promote their entrepreneurial skills. At the end sir congratulated the UGC for conducting such informative and remarkable webinar on Multidisciplinary and Holistic Education and NEP-2020 which provided the road map for the future India.

# The Webinar was conducted by Ministry of India, New Delhi.

On the occasion of completion of 1<sup>st</sup> anniversary of NEP-2020, an initiative made by Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi this national webinar has been organized collaboratively by *Minister of State for Education, Minister of School Education and Minister of Higher Education, UGC and AICTE.* 

Mr. Rajeneesh Jain, Secretary of UGC hosted the inaugural functional where Mr. D. K. Singh, Chairman of UGC welcomed all the distinguished speakers and delegates.

Mr. Anil Kare, Secretary of Higher Education, under his opening remarks beautifully explained how best Indian values must be a part of Indian education. Remembering the greatest development made in education by ancient great king *Shri Krishnadevaraya*, sir narrated that ancient education has always been a back bone for the enrichment of holistic education. He also mentioned that teachers are the primary source of imparting skills in students through innovative and creating teaching methods. He told that teachers must study the attitudes, skills, behaviors of students and develop them based on holistic models such as ethical, moral, social, global knowledge and life skills etc., which are very essential skills in this global era. Reminding the Sustainable Development Goals given by United Nations, SDG – 4 which speaks about free, equitable and primary

education to all boys and girls, "Make in India" and "Athmanirbhara" has been initiated to encourage to youth to take the lead in the development of our country, which is possible by skill based learning along the trade minds.

#### First Technical Session: "Holistic Education & NEP-2020"

University of Gujarat, in his address towards the webinar he propounded that how best the NEP-2020 braced holistic education in India. He prominently mentioned that how the ancient educational institutions such has Takshashila, Nalanda, Vallabhi etc., focused on holistic education which has a blend of materialism with spirituality. He also elaborated the significance of NEP-2020 which included environmental education, life skills, value based education, holistic education etc., which impart physical, social, emotional, intellectual, moral, professional, technical disciplines. He summarized the words by mentioning that highly capable, socially acceptable, skilled and enterprising youth will be produced to provide leadership in various spheres to face national and global changes with dedication towards the human values and which are rooted in glorious Indian culture and traditions.

Prof. Sunena Singh, Vice Chancellor of Nalanda University, addressing the webinar mentioned that NEP-2020 gives us huge flip and freedom to look at different disciplines. She also told that the dynamic education system can be fostered by not only the rules and policies given by the Ministry of Education but also by the educational institutions. She told to synergize the creative, reflective or creative thinking, entrepreneurship, scientific, compassion, community services etc., must be explored along with cognitive, intellectual and knowledge based education. She also emphased on six core concepts to be adopted in holistic education by modifying the curriculum such as critical thinking or analytical thinking, good judgment or ability of self govern or problems solving skills, meta learning – learning in one zone of freedom of learning or experiential learning, social ability, refining values and self knowledge or emotional development.

*Prof. Bhadri Narayan Vilas, Director and Professor at GB Pant Social Institute, Allahabad*, told in his speech that holistic education creates cultural values and human values to build a new nation. The knowledge produced through the introduction of NEP-2020, is the knowledge developed through experience which help the nation to build through holistic education.

# Second Technical Session - "Multidisciplinary Education and NEP-2020"

Second technical session was chaired by *Prof. M. K. Shridhar Makam*, *Member of UGC*, *former Member Secretary of Karnataka Knowledge Commission and Karnataka State Innovation Council*, in his address towards the webinar he told that multidisciplinary education is very essential to make the holistic education get to be used to its maximum way. He emphased that the curricular activities and syllabus must be included with multidiscipline subjects and multiple programs which can support students to face global competency. He also told that colleges and institutions should implement integrated subjects and proper infrastructure to move fast for expedite learning to achieve the objective of multidisciplinary education.
